“I am very pleased with today’s news that Milwaukee will be a recipient of one of the Pathways out of Poverty Awards,” said Mayor Tom Barrett. “This funding will expand our efforts training workers who are directly facing the challenges of poverty and unemployment, and introduce skills where people can find steady employment.”

Microsoft Donates to Workforce Development in Milwaukee

Over \$500,000 in free software has been donated by Microsoft Corporation through the Milwaukee Area Workforce Funding Alliance (WFA) to local workforce development nonprofit groups.

As a local site of the National Fund for Workforce Solutions (NFWS), WFA participates in the NFWS-Microsoft partnership to build the capacity of eligible workforce development organizations to better serve low-income, low-skilled individuals.

Microsoft Foundation is a funder/member of the National Fund for Workforce Solutions. Each funder/member contributes resources to the national efforts. Microsoft has committed up to \$8 million in donated software to NFWS sites.

As one of 25 sites in the National Fund for Workforce Solutions, Milwaukee submits information on nonprofits to receive an invitation to apply for up to \$50,000 in Microsoft products.



Recipients to date include Wisconsin Regional Training Partnership (WRTP), YWCA of Greater Milwaukee and Milwaukee Area Health Education Center (MAWHEC) – the 2 partnerships in Milwaukee Area Healthcare Alliance (MAHA), Neighborhood House, Milwaukee Community Service Corps, Riverworks, Milwaukee Christian Center, La Casa De Esperanza, UMOs and others.

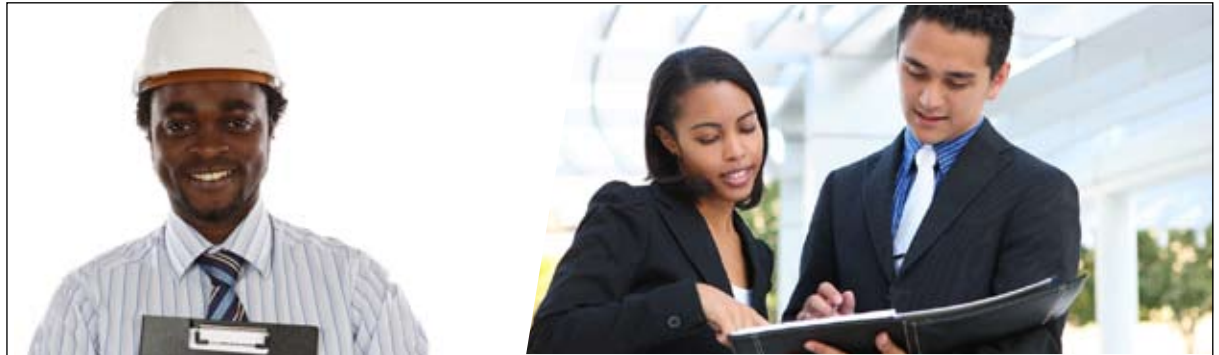

Milwaukee Area Workforce Funding Alliance (WFA) Aligns \$16M Annually

From October 1, 2008 to September 30, 2009, members of Milwaukee Area Workforce Funding Alliance (WFA) aligned over \$16 million in workforce development funds towards the goals and priorities of the WFA.

Urban Strategies is gathering grant and contract data in workforce development from members of WFA for the 6-month period of October 1, 2009 to March 31, 2010. **Information will be due to Urban Strategies on April 20th.**

Spreadsheets have been emailed to members to track not only the amount to grantees, but also the category of workforce development. This is a first step toward tracking common outcomes among funders.

Accurate financial reporting is essential to the goals of the Milwaukee Area Workforce Funding Alliance. The data will be used to report to the National Fund for Workforce Solution on our alignment activities and to further enhance your knowledge of your collective grant making efforts.

Mayor Barrett Announces \$1 million Federal Pathways out of Poverty Award for Green Job Training to Milwaukee Area Workforce Funding Alliance

On January 13, Mayor Tom Barrett announced that Milwaukee was one of five cities awarded an ARRA Pathways out of Poverty grant. The \$1 million award to the Milwaukee Area Workforce Funding Alliance will be utilized to train workers in skills for the growing green economy.

"I am very pleased with today's news that Milwaukee will be a recipient of one of the Pathways out of Poverty Awards," said Mayor Tom Barrett. "This funding will expand our efforts training workers who are directly facing the challenges of poverty and unemployment, and introduce skills where people can find steady employment."

The Pathways out of Poverty award will help expand the Milwaukee Builds Program and the Milwaukee Urban Forestry Initiative, which prepares people for careers and jobs in the construction and forestry sectors respectively. Milwaukee Build is a project of the Milwaukee Area Workforce Investment Board (MAWIB) and the City of Milwaukee's Community Development Grants Administration (CDGA). Training for urban forestry will be provided through the Milwaukee Department of Public Works, Division of Forestry. This leverages more than \$2.75 million in additional funds for Milwaukee Builds and the Urban Forestry Initiative.

Jobs For the Future (JFF) was the national recipient of the ARRA grant of which Milwaukee Area Workforce Funding Alliance (WFA) is one of 25 local sites. The WFA will utilize the funds to enhance the jobs-to-career connections for participants through additional credentials and employer contacts.

Milwaukee Community Service Corps, Milwaukee Christian Center, Northcott Neighborhood House and Wisconsin Regional Training Partnership (WRTP), and MAWIB and Housing Authority of City of Milwaukee will recruit, train, support and place over 300 workers with support from the Pathways Out of Poverty program.

What is the Solar Hot Water Business Council?

The Solar Hot Water Business Council is an offshoot of the City of Milwaukee's solar energy program, Milwaukee Shines, and was inspired by the results of an independent consultant's feasibility study for the City on creating a local solar hot water (SHW) manufacturing cluster.

The study was released last year and suggests that Milwaukee is well suited in becoming a SHW components manufacturing cluster because of its:

- Proximity to an emerging local SHW market
- Access to a booming national and global market
- Access to an abundant and fresh water source
- Manufacturing expertise (Milwaukee is home to over 3,000 manufacturers, many of whom produce easily adapted components)
- Availability of state incentives for renewable energy components manufacturing
- Availability of land for business expansion or relocation
